**SUBJECT:** CONSENT CALENDAR: APPROVAL OF THE SETA GOVERNING BOARD ACTION TO ACCEPT FUNDING FROM THE CALIFORNIA WELLNESS FOUNDATION

**RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the Sacramento City Council:

1. Approve a Modification to the Joint Powers Agreement to Approve SETA receiving funds from the California Wellness Foundation.
2. Direct the Clerk of the Board to return one certified copy of this document to the Sacramento Employment and Training Agency office.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Sacramento Employment and Training Agency (SETA) Governing Board has approved an action that requires the review and approval of your body before such action is considered final and authorized.

Under the Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement, SETA is required to request authority from the Partners (the City of Sacramento and the County of Sacramento) to accept any form of financial assistance and the operation and administration by the Agency of any human service program other than those specifically authorized pursuant to the Agreement.

The Sacramento Employment and Training Agency is the designated grantee for a number of grants to provide services to Sacramento City and County residents. In the last year, SETA has concentrated on developing programs to assist foster youth successfully transition from foster care to self-sufficiency. The purpose of this funding (to be utilized over 36 months) is:


1. To build leadership among former foster youth by training and supporting three peer mentors each year, including connecting them with health, mental health and other support that may be necessary;
2. To develop leadership among peer mentors by teaching the skills that will enable them to connect with a minimum of 75 current foster youth each year through workshops and community meetings.

SETA was awarded \$142,000 to implement this new grant to build peer leadership as a component of a new program providing a variety of mental health, employment, educational, and other support services for youth emancipating from the foster care system.

**FINANCIAL ANALYSIS:** Includes one new funding source to SETA's budget.


