Recommendation:

Adopt a Resolution finding and declaring that the local emergency associated with Hurricane Katrina Relief is no longer necessary. Pursuant to Chapter 2.116 of the City Code, the Council is required to periodically determine whether or not the local emergency continues. The local emergency associated with Hurricane Katrina Relief should be terminated at this time.

Summary: This report recommends that the Council approve a resolution.

Background Information:

On September 6, 2005, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2005-654 and thereby declared a local emergency and requested that the Governor declare a state of emergency with regard to the receipt and care of evacuees and victims of Hurricane Katrina. Pursuant to Chapter 2.116 of the City Code and state law, the City Council is required to periodically review the status of the local emergency and determine whether the local emergency continues or whether it should be terminated.

The governor requested that the President declare California a disaster area because of Hurricane Katrina evacuees. On September 13, 2005, the President issued a disaster declaration for California because of the Hurricane Katrina evacuees. As a result, Sacramento can be reimbursed for all eligible costs associated with planning and operations for housing Hurricane Katrina evacuees

On October 6, 2005 the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2005-719 declaring the continuation of a local emergency caused by response to Hurricane Katrina.

On October 18, 2005, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2005-753 declaring the continuation of a local emergency caused by response to Hurricane Katrina.

Pursuant to Chapter 2.116 of the Sacramento City Code, the City Council shall terminate the local emergency at the earliest possible date conditions warrant. The City of Sacramento is not currently scheduled to receive Hurricane Katrina evacuees and victims. Many victims have had their needs met through the housing program at Mather, through the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency, and through the American Red Cross.

There is no longer a continuing need to declare a local emergency with regard to Hurricane Katrina.

Financial Considerations: The City can be reimbursed for certain eligible costs associated with activities conducted in support of sheltering activities for Hurricane Katrina victims. There is no current need to shelter Hurricane Katrina victims.

Environmental Considerations: None.

Policy Considerations:

Staff recommends that the Council approve the attached resolution to terminate the declaration of local emergency related to relief provided to victims of Hurricane Katrina.

RESOLUTION DECLARING THAT LOCAL EMERGENCY CAUSED BY RESPONSE TO HURRICANE KATRINA IS TERMINATED

BACKGROUND

- A. On September 6, 2005, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2005-654 and thereby declared a local emergency and requested that the Governor declare a state of emergency with regard to the receipt and care of evacuees and victims of Hurricane Katrina. Pursuant to Chapter 2.116 of the City Code and state law, the Council is required to review the facts periodically to determine whether the local emergency continues or whether it should be terminated.
- B. On October 6, 2005 the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2005-719 declaring the continuation of a local emergency caused by response to Hurricane Katrina. On October 18, 2005 the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2005-753 declaring the continuation of a local emergency caused by response to Hurricane Katrina.
- C. The City of Sacramento is not currently scheduled to receive Hurricane Katrina evacuees and victims. Many victims have had their needs met through the housing program at Mather, through the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency, and through the American Red Cross.
- D. There is no longer a continuing need to declare a local emergency with regard to Hurricane Katrina.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The facts set forth in the Background are true and correct.
- Section 2. The council finds and proclaims that there is no need for continuing the local emergency declared with regard to Hurricane Katrina in Resolution No. 2005-654, and continued in Resolution 2005-719 and 2005-753.
- Section 3. The Council further finds that the local emergency created by Hurricane Katrina is terminated.

Section 4. The City Manager or his designee shall forward a copy of this Resolution to the State Director of Emergency Services in accordance with the provisions of the Natural Disaster Assistance Act.
