**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL IN SUPPORT OF LOCATING
THE CAPITOL AREA STATE HOUSE IN DOWNTOWN SACRAMENTO**

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento enjoys the honor and prestige of being the capital of the most populous state in the nation; and

WHEREAS, Downtown Sacramento is a vibrant area undergoing a renaissance; and

WHEREAS, since Governor Reagan moved from the historic mansion downtown, several generations of governors have lived in rented quarters scattered throughout the area; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for an official permanent residence for California's governor in downtown Sacramento; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Permanent Residence Commission, in its Final Report issued June 30, 2000, identified four appropriate and suitable downtown sites, one being Site G, bounded by 11th and 12th, P and Q Streets; and

WHEREAS, Site G has multiple advantages, among which are the proximity to the State Capitol, minimum acquisition costs, accessibility and reduction of commute time.
