SUMMARY

It is proposed that the City Council approve submittal of an application to the California State Department of Parks and Recreation for funds allocated by the Legislature for the Sacramento History Center. This report further recommends approval of an agreement with the Sacramento History Center, Inc., regarding this project.

BACKGROUND

The Sacramento History Center, located adjacent to the California State Railroad Museum in the National Historic Landmark District of Old Sacramento is scheduled to open in June 1985. Sacramento History Center, Inc., a nonprofit organization, will operate and maintain the facility in accordance with the provisions of their 20-year leased agreement with the City, executed in September 1982 and amended in September 1984. This agreement further charges Sacramento History Center, Inc., with funding the design, fabrication, and installation of the center's four galleries and exhibits chronicling the development of the Sacramento Valley.

Assemblyman Phillip Isenberg sponsored legislation in September 1984 to directly allocate \$275,000 from the State Department of Parks and Recreation's account for Capital outlay to the Sacramento History Center. A copy of AB 1346 is attached. A formal application to the State Department of Parks and Recreation is necessary to receive these funds.

It is proposed that the funds be utilized to complete the Geological Imperative Gallery. The Gallery will be devoted entirely to man's interaction with the environment and influence upon the ecological history of the Sacramento Valley for a period of 10,000 years, thereby, providing visitors with an indepth understanding of our natural resources.

As the Sacramento History Center, Inc., a nonprofit organization, is responsible for financing the development of the Center's galleries and exhibits, it is appropriate that they are designated as the City's agent in administering these funds. An agreement between the City and Sacramento History Center, Inc., is necessary to specify the purpose and conditions of the project funds.

Terms of the agreement include the allocation of these funds directly to the Sacramento History Center, Inc., for the purpose of designing the Geological Imperative Gallery. Sacramento History Center, Inc., shall assume responsibility for the administration of State funds and for completion of the project but shall be accountable to both the State and City. Sacramento History Center, Inc., shall assume all liability and insurance costs for this project.

FINANCIAL DATA

The total cost of the Geological Imperative Gallery of the Sacramento History Center is estimated at \$350,705. Proposed funding sources are as follows:



There are no direct City costs.


RECOMMENDATION

Assembly Bill No. 1346

CHAPTER 1082

An act to amend and supplement the Budget Act of 1984 by adding Item 3790-102-036 thereto, relating to parks and recreation, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

[Approved by Governor September 12, 1984. Filed with Secretary of State September 12, 1984.]

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1346, Isenberg. Parks and recreation: Sacramento History Center.

(1) The Budget Act of 1984 appropriates funds to the Department of Parks and Recreation for various purposes.

This bill would appropriate \$275,000 to the department from the Special Account for Capital Outlay to be allocated for local assistance for the Sacramento History Center.

(2) The bill would take effect immediately as an urgency statute. Appropriation: yes.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Item 3790-102-036 is added to the Budget Act of 1984 (Chapter 258, Statutes of 1984), to read:

3790-102-036--For local assistance, Department of Parks and Recreation, payable from the Special Account for Capital Outlay..... 275,000

Schedule:

(1) City of Sacramento, Sacramento History Center..... 275,000

SEC. 2. This act is an urgency statute necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety within the meaning of Article IV of the Constitution and shall go into immediate effect. The facts constituting the necessity are:

This act provides funds for the Sacramento History Center. The center will be located in Old Sacramento, itself a National Historic Landmark, on a site immediately adjacent to the California State Railroad Museum, one of California's two most popular state parks. In order that this project may be completed at the earliest possible time, it is necessary that this act take effect immediately.

0
