**RESOLUTION APPROVING THE GENERAL PLAN  
ADVISORY COMMITTEE (M04-004)**

**WHEREAS**, the public should be fully engaged in the general plan update process to educate, obtain public input on plan polices and objectives and work towards community consensus on a vision for the future; and

**WHEREAS**, it is anticipated that the General Plan Update process will take approximately two years; and

**WHEREAS**, affected stakeholders should be represented in the citizen participation process including community and neighborhood groups, utility and service providers, educational institutions, industry and business groups, civic and community organizations, non-governmental organizations, religious communities and other public agencies; and

**WHEREAS**, a General Plan Advisory Committee (GPAC) representing a broad and diverse group of community interests and planning expertise is necessary to facilitate community outreach and provide advise on the General Plan Update.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO THAT:

1. Establishes the General Plan Advisory Committee. There is hereby established the General Plan Advisory Committee for the General Plan Update.
2. Approves the Purpose of the Committee. The Committee is established for the purpose of building community support and reviewing the commenting on the General Plan Update.
3. Approves the Duties of the Committee Members. The Committee's primary duties shall be the following:
  - a. Work collaboratively to confirm the community outreach process, identify stakeholder interests and review General Plan work products and concerns raised by the community, staff and consultants.
  - b. Attend all regularly scheduled meetings having reviewed previous meeting summaries and background materials distributed in advance of each meeting.
  - c. Participate in and sponsor townhall workshops and consider public comments and concerns in development of the General Plan Update.
  - d. Provide effective representation by consulting their organizations or geographic area constituents on upcoming issues and informing them about the General Plan Update process.
4. Appointment of Committee Members.
  - a. The Committee will consist of no more than twenty-five (25) members, with at least one nomination from each council district, including but not limited to, Planning Academy graduates, City Manager Academy graduates, Planning Commission, Design Review Board, community and neighborhood groups, educational institutions, industry and business groups, civic and community organizations, non-governmental organizations, religious communities and other planning organizations.
  - b. The length of term served by each Committee member is a 24-month period beginning at the first meeting of the Committee.
  - c. The sunset date of the Committee will be 24-months after the first meeting of the Committee.
