

RESOLUTION No. 133

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

January 31st, 1929

WHEREAS, the City Council determined the necessity of and provided an appropriation in sum of \$7,500.00 in the 1929 Budget for the installation of automatic traffic signals in the City of Sacramento; and


WHEREAS, City Manager H. A. Kluegel in conjunction with the Engineering and Electrical Departments of the City promptly, upon availability of foregoing appropriation, proceeded with the experiment of mounting an automatic system upon old discarded electrolier posts and use of city labor in erection thereof; and

WHEREAS, such action on part of City Manager has resulted in the installation recently made at 21st and L Streets costing approximately \$1,000.00 less than the system at 21st and Y Streets,


THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Manager and Departments assisting, be hereby highly complimented for the saving thus shown, the judgment used in type selected, the efficient workmanship on part of employes and prompt action in proceeding with the installation of the system, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager be hereby directed to present plans and specifications to the City Council for further installations of signal traffic systems.
